THE ESSENTIAL MASTER MASON

A Master Mason is one who has taken the three Degrees of ancient Craft Masonry, according to a certain ritual, and in honor has bound himself to the practice of the great moral virtues, rendering unto God that reverence due from a creature to his Creator, and doing unto his neighbor that which he wishes his neighbor should do unto him. The precepts and teaching of Masonry are the same now as in the days of Solomon, and the same in one country as in another. Freemasonry believes as firmly today in the Fatherhood of God and the Brotherhood of Man as it did in all prior days.

That one man is as good as another, and that neither worldly wealth nor station make superiority, was taught by Masons in the days long before our present civilization. Today it is still taught in all Masonic Lodges that if a man regards the human species as one, with each individual to aid, support and protect the other to the end that the distressed may be relieved, the unfortunate sympathized with, and peace restored to troubled minds; if he is good and true, with proper restraint upon his affections and passions, avoiding excesses in all things, and rendering unto every man his just dues, he has the characteristics required of Master Masons the world over.

A Master Mason should be the personification of all that is good and true in life, and in his daily life should exemplify the cardinal virtues of temperance, fortitude, prudence and justice. That one is a Master Mason should be, and ordinarily is, a sufficient passport to the respect and confidence of humankind. Only a good and true man can be a Master Mason.

While among those who have been taught that Masonry is a secret, oath-bound institution, selfish in its ends and unscrupulous in the attainment of these ends, there may be some prejudice against one who is a Master Mason. This prejudice is misplaced – Masonry only tries to take good men and make them better. Its goals and meeting places and activities are public, and only its ritual is secret. It is not a religion nor a substitute for one, and admits men of every race and creed, so long as they agree with its basic principles.

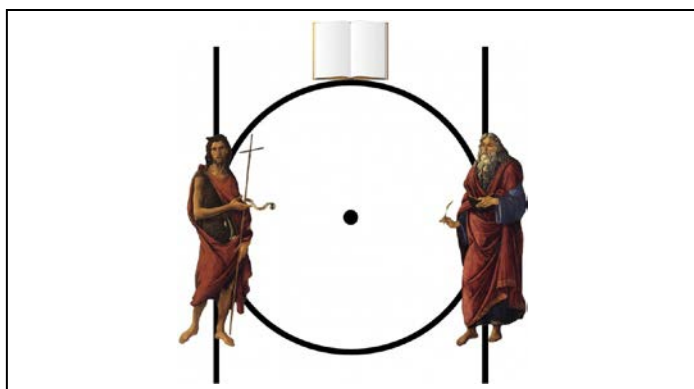
**The Annual Feast of St. John
