Brethren,

It has finally become possible for us to resume meeting in person. Stated Meetings are now being done in person, Social Nights are now being done in person, and a 1st degree was recently conducted. The masking requirement remains, but that is just an inconvenience, not a fundamental impediment, and can be tolerated to help ensure the safety of all involved. At this point in time, it is not clear how the recent LA City vaccination rules will affect us.

Congratulations to Cleveland Palmer, who recently received his 1st degree. It's the first step on his Masonic journey. We'll have more degrees upcoming, but for pandemic delay reasons, they probably won't start until January.

The Hall Association is of necessity addressing the air conditioning issues in the building. The AC for the dining room is being replaced, as it is too old to be repaired. The two ACs that serve the lodge room are now working, but still need some servicing and repairs. Same for the AC for the Goose and Gridiron room. It remains to be seen what we will do with the one that services the entryway. These large expenses come at a time when our income is very limited.

The Vote Center rental of the lodge went well, the largest problem being the non-operational AC. Using the lodge for voting has several advantages: it exposes the community to Masonry, it brings in rental income, and it helps fulfil our obligation for community service.

The Annual Lodge Holiday party will be on Wednesday Dec. 8 at the Lodge, and it will be in person! We had to cancel last year's party, but unless the Covid rules change, we will have it this year. Plan to attend, bring the kids and grandkids, invite your neighbors and their kids! The Lodge is very pleased to resume this holiday tradition.

Additional Actions

In accordance with CMC §801.065, the Grand Lodge (GL) granted charters to Benicia Lodge, U.D., The Thirty-Three Lodge, U.D., & Columbia Historic Lodge, U.D., & entered them into the Registry of this GL as Benicia Lodge #877, The Thirty-Three Lodge #878 & Columbia Historic Lodge.

The GL approved requests of mutual recognition with the GL of Lithuania A.F. & A.M., & the Grand Orient of Rio de Janeiro (Brazil). The GL voted to request mutual recognition with the MW Prince Hall GL of Tennessee.

In accordance with CMC §407.050, the GL adopted the budget for 2021-2022 as proposed by the Deputy Grand Master. The background check fee was set at \$30.

The per capita assessment for the fiscal year Nov 1, 2022, through Oct 31, 2023, as proposed by the Sr. Grand Warden, was adopted and fixed at \$57.50.

MW Jeffrey M. Wilkins was installed as the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge.
