



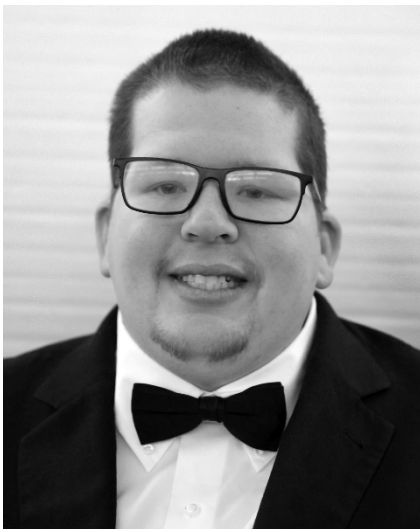

FOR REFLECTION

TWO QUESTIONS WORTH ASKING OVER AND OVER AGAIN

There are two significant questions every Mason should ask himself throughout his Masonic career and for the rest of his life.

At the outset, the Novitiate is queried on why he presents himself for admission to the Fraternity. Why does he seek to take upon himself Masonic obligations, membership, and attendant responsibilities? Simply, for what reason does he seek to assume the character and nature of a Freemason? What has he come here to do? What's the goal? What is he looking for?

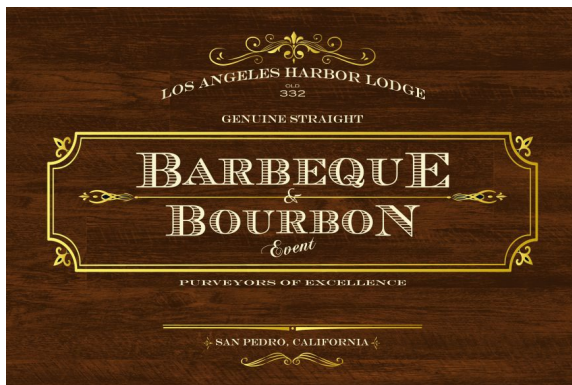
Shortly thereafter, another inquiry of even greater import is propounded: What, above all else, does the Candidate most desire? The question is often misunderstood to inquire of what the candidate most desires at that particular moment in the ritual ceremony. However, it should be regarded as a double entendre, and we are really inquiring what is of ultimate worth to this Candidate. The inquiring is not about just one evening in a single ceremony in a Lodge somewhere. It is meant for the Candidate to express upon what he thinks builds a life.

With our yesterdays now more than our tomorrows, what in my life speaks most to you? What are your core values that best define the kind of person you would like to be? In the tradition of Scripture, we speak of finding the one pearl of great value or the treasure hidden in a field that above all else should be sought and obtained. Perhaps Freemasonry provides the tools to aid in that search, or to help us know when we have found it.

These two deceptively simple questions – “What do I expect to gain from Freemasonry?” and the closely allied query “What is of greatest worth to me?” – are the primary lessons taught throughout the entire Masonic journey. If Masonry causes us to retain these inquiries and ask them over and over again in the quiet recesses of our inner being and throughout the course of a lifetime, then we will have received one of the greatest gifts the Craft can bestow. For in our answers will we discover our core values and how to live in accord with them.

The event ended with ANOTHER social hour, this one much longer than the previous one.

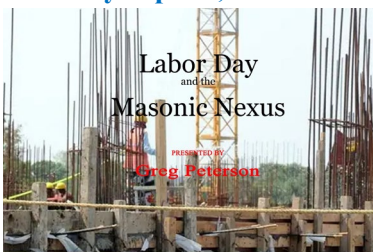
